Edward Hynes Charter School CEO's Report February 6, 2023

Students and Academics

- 1. February is Black History Month. Each school has several dedicated events planned to celebrate the history, culture, and contributions of people of color with their students and staff.
- 2. The third quarter will end on Friday, March 10, 2023. Report cards for students in grades K-8 will be distributed on March 23, 2023. Report cards for kindergarten students will be by appointment, and the children do not have class on this day.
- 3. Bulletin 1566 requires a few added steps to ensure that current third and fourth graders are performing on grade level as it relates to reading fluency. All parents/guardians have been informed of their child's current performance status. Thirty hours of extra phonics and fluency instruction will be needed for students to be promoted. This applies to all who are below the benchmark in their end-of-year assessments.
- 4. The LEAP (Louisiana Educational Assessment Program) 2025 test security training for all staff will take place on March 29, 2023. This is needed per state guidelines. ELPT and LEAP Connect assessments begin February 13, 2023. Test administrators and coordinators were previously trained on this year's security measures.
- 5. Hynes-Lakeview student, Tru D., will advance to the regional competition for student of the year.

Faculty, Staff, and Administration

- 1. The Hynes campuses are fully staffed. The staffing calendar of events kicked off with current staff giving their letters of intent.
- 2. Staffing recruitment for 2023-24 is underway. The GNOCCS (Greater New Orleans Collaborative of Charter Schools) Teacher Fair will be held in the Hynes-Lakeview Gym on Saturday, March 4, 2023.
- 3. Over 45 teachers and leaders are taking part in our Hynes Aspiring Leaders Program, a yearlong book study on the strategies and best practices used at our Hynes Schools.

Family and Community Involvement

- 1. The tentative date for groundbreaking for the Hynes-UNO campus is Wednesday, March 29, 2023, at 3PM. If that date works, it will be scheduled and planned.

Operations and Facilities

- 1. Currently enrolled students have been given the opportunity to re-register for 2023-24.
- 2. The Mardi Gras holiday is Friday, February 17-24, 2023. Classes resume on Monday, February 27, 2023.
- 3. The Main Round of the 2023-24 admissions process in Enroll NOLA closed in January. The match will be released in March.
- 4. The Hynes Network will undergo a Cognia review in the 2023-24 school year.
- 5. We will have the 2023-24 instructional calendar by March 13, 2023.
