# Hynes Charter School Corporation CEO Report September 23, 2024

### Celebration!

Cognia has named the Hynes Charter School Corporation as a "System of Distinction." We are one of 60 institutions (49 schools, 11 systems) out of 1,952 Cognia accreditation reviews to be recognized with this honor. The institutions represent 23 states and five countries.

#### Students & Academic

l extend my gratitude to our network team and school leaders for addressing the complex changes connected to new state legislation and Louisiana Department of Education policies. Those include:

- Transferring Act 771 (high dosage tutoring for K-5) into practice. The Impact Day was
  devoted to analyzing student data and developing action plans to meet the varying needs
  of our students. As a result, students will have an Individual Academic Support Plan
  (IASP) which can include high dosage tutoring. This change is captured in the PPP.
- Receiving training (school administrators and six network leaders) in the Louisiana Educator's Rubric (LER). This evaluation and feedback system is replacing COMPASS. The school year 2024-25 is designated as a "learning" year for teachers and observers. This learning year is designed to set everyone up to maximize student success as the state transitions to a new accountability system in 2025-26.
- Receiving training (six network leaders and all principals) in the Louisiana Leader Rubric (LLR) designed to align with the LER and maximize a leader's ability to transform their schools through the implementation of best practices for school leaders.
- Navigating support for teachers and leaders through changing times takes compassion, patience, and strong leadership.

#### Faculty, Staff, and Administration

- 1. Our schools are still fully staffed. I recently approved new positions to meet the needs of our growing population of diverse learners.
- 2. New Orleans Public Schools closed for Hurricane Francine and lost three instructional days and a few hours from Tuesday, September 10<sup>th</sup>.
- 3. Act 260 has all 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade teachers and administrators in a numeracy course designed to improve teacher understanding and instruction of mathematics.
- Through Cambiar, the "Lift All Boats" training is a one-year program for 14 of our leaders, to develop core leadership skills so that the Hynes high yield practices are codified. The first session is November 1st.

### Family and Community Involvement

- 1. The Hynes Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) hosted a successful Meet and Greet at the Hynes-UNO campus for all three schools from 5-7PM. The next meeting is Wednesday, September 25th at 5PM at the Hynes-UNO campus.
- 2. School tours for new families are scheduled on November 14, November 21st, and December 5th.

## **Operations and Facilities**

- 1. A ribbon cutting ceremony will be scheduled as soon as the weather is cooler, and student groups can be selected to take part in the program.
- 2. Basketball courts and four goals were delivered, and the installation was put on hold due to Francine.

# Edward Hynes Charter Schools Facilities Report September 23, 2024

#### UNO:

- We have experienced some HVAC issues at the site. Several of the classroom and office units have malfunctioned. Also, we experienced a power outage before the storm. When the power was restored, the surge destroyed twelve control boards for the HVAC units that serve classrooms. Currently, our engineers and contractors are investigating to correct both issues. We are also waiting for the data to support the power surge from the Lemoine subcontractors. This situation may be outside of the warranty, thus causing us to be responsible for the cost.
- There are several change order work items in process: a canopy from the cafeteria to the dismissal overhang, card swipe access points, and sidewalk.
   These are slated to start in the next couple of weeks.

#### Lakeview:

- The MOU for building Improvements for this site is being submitted for your review and signature. This project is still in the design phase.
- Our yearly NOLA PS building inspection is scheduled for next month.
- Synergy is working on an Entergy Smart Program package for us that will cover 95-100 percent of the cost for upgrading our lighting interior/exterior to LED. We are awaiting their report.
