Alvin Miester, III, Board President, called the meeting to order at 5:15 pm and proceeded with the agenda.

- 1. Approval to amend the agenda. Barbara Richard made a motion to amend the December 9, 2024, meeting agenda to include an additional action item for new business regarding the HVAC contract for Hynes-UNO. Cassandra Youmans seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by vote of board members present.
- 2. Approval of amended agenda. Helene Derbigny made a motion to approve the October 21, 2024, meeting agenda. Cassandra Youmans seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by vote of board members present.
- 3. **Approval of minutes.** Bill Chauvin made a motion to waive the reading of and to approve the October 21, 2024, board meeting minutes. Helene Derbigny seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.

12. New business.

- a. Bill Chauvin made a motion to approve a resolution for Hynes Charter School Corporation to provide the staff with the one-time stipend allocated by the Louisiana Legislature during the 2024 regular session. Barbara Richard seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- b. Cassandra Youmans made a motion to approve a resolution for Hynes Charter School Corporation to allocate the differentiated compensation funds approved by the Louisiana Legislature during the 2024 regular session for the stipends earned by teacher leaders on the Leading For Success teams. Bill Chauvin seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- c. Barbara Richard made a motion to approve a resolution authorizing Michelle Douglas to act on behalf of Hynes Charter School Corporation regarding the use of the \$200,000 provided by Act 776 from the Louisiana Legislature during the 2024 regular session, which is to be used for the playground project at Hynes-UNO. Helene Derbigny seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- d. Jan Janz made a motion to approve a resolution regarding the substitution of Kris Scairono with Bill Chauvin on all Hynes accounts at Hancock Whitney National Bank. Barbara Richard seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- e. Bill Chauvin made a motion to approve Hynes Charter School Corporation entering a data sharing agreement with the Louisiana Workplace Commission. Barbara Richard seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- f. Bill Chauvin made a motion to approve the request from the Hynes Charter School-UNO PTO to host a soiree as an annual fundraising event on the school campus to include food, alcoholic beverage consumption, and/or raffle with the understanding that the following conditions are met; security for the event, proof of insurance, and beverages served by holders of a "ServSafe" card. Special event permits issued by the City of New Orleans and the Louisiana Commissioner of Alcohol and Tobacco Control and approval from NOLAPS, as necessary. The fair will be held on

- April 5, 2025. Helene Derbigny seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- g. Helene Derbigny made a motion to authorize the CEO to sign an agreement with Caveon, a monitoring service to enhance the integrity of state assessments administered in our schools in accordance with the requirement of the Louisiana State Department of Education ("LDOE"). Jan Janz seconded the motions. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.
- h. Barbara Richard made a motion to approve the HVAC contract with Gootee service for Hynes-UNO. Jan Janz seconded the motion. With no public comment, the motion carried by a unanimous vote of board members present.

With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn was made by Cassandra Youmans, seconded by Bill Chauvin, and passed unanimously by a vote of board members present. The meeting was adjourned at 6:14 pm.

Students & Academic

- The first semester is over, and our report cards for quarter 2 will be distributed on Thursday, January 16th. All processes for mid-year progress tracking toward promotion are being followed.
- 2. Each campus has set 3rd quarter goals and our faculty and staff continue to set and pursue ambitious student learning targets for student growth through collaboration, PLCs, data analysis, and high dosage tutoring.

Faculty, Staff, and Administration
