# Students & Academic

- 1. The window for the LEAP Connect and the ELPT has opened, and we project these assessments will last until the end of next week.
- 2. Schools are currently assessing students for Quarter 3 progress.
- 3. High Dosage Tutoring has been in full force, and through progress monitoring and flexible staffing of small group tutors, some students have successfully met their targets and have been moved out of HDT.
- 4. KinderRoots parent/guardian classroom visits will be held at each campus in the coming weeks. The intention behind these meetings is to share end of year Kindergarten goals with families specifically about reading and writing.

## Faculty, Staff, and Administration

- Dr. Wright was named as a Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST). This distinguished honor is awarded by the National Science Foundation. He will be recognized in Washington, DC.
- 2. We are currently staffing vacancies at each site. Vacancies include 4<sup>th</sup> grade, teaching assistant, PE and ELA.

# Family and Community Involvement

- 1. The Superbowl brought a lot of fun opportunities for our schools.
  - a. Parkview received a \$5,000 donation from the NFL Players Association as part of their Play 60/ Service project day.
  - b. Lakeview received a \$1,000 donation from Play 60/ American Heart Association.
  - c. UNO students took part in a Play 60 event at Pan American stadium.
- 2. The University of New Orleans Federal Credit Union is treating the staff at each school to king cake next week as they continue to develop our partnership.
- 3. PTOs are holding their quarterly meetings and events:
  - a. Parkview recently elected their new board. They are also holding a Parent/Student Sneaker Ball on March 15<sup>th</sup>
  - b. UNO is holding their Sweetheart dance on February 22<sup>nd</sup>.
  - c. Lakeview recently held their "SnowBall" for special guests and students.
- 4. The Krewe of UNO is having their annual parade on Tuesday, February 25<sup>th</sup>, and our students at Hynes-UNO Kindergarten students and the Pep Squad have been invited to take part.
- 5. Hynes will donate 40 meals to support the third district New Orleans Police Department who are protecting the Endymion parade route.
- 6. Next Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) is on April 9th at UNO.
- 7. Four talented theater students from Hynes-Lakeview introduced keynote speakers at the Plain Talk About Reading conference last week. These students wrote, memorized, and performed introductory skits—they were fabulous and authentic. They introduced Dr. Robert "Bob" Brooks who is known for his seminal work in resilience, motivation, and family relationships on Wednesday. And on Friday,

- they introduced Jake Daggett, a social media influencer and expert in phonics and structured literacy.
- 8. The Hynes-Lakeview 8<sup>th</sup> grade student of the year has moved on to the regional interview round.

# Operations and Facilities

- 1. Our CFO will provide an update on the NOLAPS budgeting issue.
- 2. The main round of the NO Common Application Process has closed. The match for the main round will be released on March 31<sup>st</sup>. The deadline for new matches to register is April 25<sup>th</sup>.
- 3. The window for early childhood applications closes on February 21st.
- 4. Hynes-Lakeview and Hynes-Parkview must make up 75 minutes of instructional time. Hynes-UNO must make up 195 minutes of instructional time.

### UNO:

 Hynes-PTO has begun the planning phase of the new playground setup. This is being funded by the allocation from the state legislature

### Lakeview:

The next phase of repair improvements is now in the procurement phase. This is
the continuation of the envelope work to address issues from the original
construction of the building. This is being funded by NOLA PS.

### Parkview:

- Fencing/Gate upgrades are currently still in the procurement phase. NOLA PS is handling the procurement process and funding of this project was awarded through application process.
- Our yearly NOLA PS facilities building walk-through occurred last week, and everything went well.
- Hynes Parkview PTO is currently in the process of funding A/V upgrades to the cafeteria. This will enhance educational events as well as staff/community meetings. This is funded through a donation by the Hynes-Parkview PTO.
